International Convention Registration

The LCI website has been re-designed. The Convention registration form may be found on the Lions Clubs International website at:

Do not use the on-line system. Download the form, fill it out and mail it using the instructions below. We have to be registered before May 1 to get the \$100 rate. It goes up to the late registration fee of \$150 on May 2.

Registration Update News (February 16, 2009) – LCI informs us that the On-line registration form is not programmed to give MD5M Volunteering Lions the special discounted \$100 rate. In order to get the special

pricing, LCI recommends that we use the paper form and register by mail. We also suggest highlighting the “MD5M” and the rate of “\$100” so the person inputting the information will notice the special rates.

Host Committee Volunteer Registration Update

We need the most help attracting volunteers for:

- District Governor Elect School –the school starts the week before the convention at the Minneapolis Convention Center. You do not need to be registered for the convention to volunteer before the convention starts from June 29. You only need to be registered for the convention during the convention times on July 6 – 10. Contact PID Maynard Rucks if you have any questions.**
- Sergeant-At-Arms – Convention registration is required**
- Parade Marshals – No convention registration is required.**
- Airport Drivers – No convention registration is required.**
- Hotel and Airport Greeters – No convention registration is required.**
